The only other retail business around for miles was the Giant Food grocery store. I've heard stories about how his "old cronies" told him he was going to "starve to death out there in the country!" Grandfather's car dealership, Dudley Martin Chevrolet, is still thriving in the same location today. No wonder his nickname was "Kingfish"!

My father was an only child who sacrificed his love for military life to come home and help his father run the dealership. He also served the community as a member of the Manassas Town Council, Manassas Volunteer Rescue Squad and Manassas Volunteer Fire Department, to name a few. I can't tell you how many times that old siren would go off as my Dad and I were out shooting hoops. He would always run to his car and speed off to the firehouse – his love for the Manassas community was always on his sleeve.

The Lows were a British couple who flew the Union Jack flag during the Civil War as a symbol of their neutrality. As a result, they managed to keep the structure intact and not a shot was fired within the house during the entire course of the Civil War.

Dawn and Scott Donaldson are the Inn's current owners, having been chosen from a pool of over 30 applicants in 2000 by the Vint Hill Economic Development Authority. They have since renovated the building and rejuvenated it to its current elegant state, fulfilling a life-long dream. Prior to taking over the Inn, Dawn and Scott owned Chandler's Classic American Deli in the Prince William County Courthouse.

In addition to hosting corporate events, such as the recent Power of Partnership Joint Networking Extravaganza, the Donaldson's offer many services at the Inn, including hosting and catering a wide variety of corporate, family and social events, and catering off-site at client locations. 
